Course Level	Learners should have a basic knowledge of sewing

Any skills or qualifications needed for entry to the class	Learners should have a basic knowledge of sewing. They will be able to choose from different projects depending on their ability.
Materials required for first class Course description – Including a	Small offcut pieces of colourful fabrics to use for applique, 25x30cm piece of thicker lighter coloured fabric, preferably without a pattern. Black cotton, 25x30cm piece of interfacing, 30cm of bond-a-web available at sewing shops, scissors, pins.

Including aims & objectives

Participants will learn how to do Free Motion Embroidery using a sewing machine. They will be able to apply principles of Free Motion Embroidery to make various projects depending on their ability. The choice of projects will be pictures, key rings, lined purses and zip up bags. Students will also learn how to embroider words and names to personalise their items. Students will be given a small homework each lesson to improve their skills and apply their knowledge.

How Progress & Success will be recorded:

Progress will be recorded by photographic evidence. Learners are also required to fill out an Individual Learning Plan to record their progress.
