Course description - Including aims & objectives This course will enable you to develop an appreciation of Spanish language and culture, and to communicate in a range of everyday and more complex situations. There will be a greater focus on grammar, pronunciation & syntax; and we will often use authentic texts in Spanish to contextualise the language focus of the lesson.	
Learning outcomes: A broader understanding of how to express yourself to communicate effectively in Spanish, and how to make sense of what others are seeking to communicate. Teaching and learning methods used: A variety of activities to develop your comprehension of spoken and written Spanish and to help build your vocabulary and confidence when expressing yourself in different situations - these include: identifying key points; giving your opinion and justifying it. There will also be optional activities to complete between lessons some of which may be online.	
How Progress & Success will be recorded: Each lesson I will use a variety of informal techniques for checking & understanding, without putting you on the spot! I encourage members of the group to support one another and aim to	

<p>develop a sense of camaraderie & fun within the group. As the course progresses we will regularly use areas of language previously covered in new contexts. You will be asked to complete an individual learning plan at intervals to monitor progress towards your personal (and the group's collective) goals throughout the course.</p>
