How Progress & Success will be recorded:

There will be regular checks at the beginning and end of lessons and in the shape of short tests to enable you to monitor your own progress. Speaking in role plays and presentations will be recorded (with your agreement!), another way of letting you see and hear how you are progressing.

Learning outcomes: Teaching and learning methods used:

Teaching will be through presentation and practice of materials using the 4 main language skills. We will use the Talk German 1 course book and accompanying CDs, as well as a wide range of relevant websites, newspapers, magazines, easy readers and film.

After each class you will be advised to revise what you have learned and to prepare, vocabulary or dialogue for example, for the next class. You may be asked to do some background research using German websites to inform the class, or to do short reading or writing exercises. Each student will complete an individual tracker form to monitor their learning goals throughout the course.
