Materials required for first class	A box to take flowers home each week.

Course description - Including aims & objectives

The students will be introduced to a variety of flower pastes and required tools and equipment will be discussed.

The first task will be the making of small simple wired flowers without any flower cutters (lesson 1). This will be followed by the making of small flowers using a variety of small blossom cutters (lesson 2). This will teach the student some of the more basic flower making skills. We will then move onto making carnations which teaches (lesson 2 and 3) different, but essential skills. Lesson 4 will cover the beginning of roses, putting calyxes on carnations and smaller flowers. Lesson 5 will complete roses and make freehand leaves which will be veined. Lesson 6 will cover taping wires, colouring the made flowers and creating a spray from them.

How Progress & Success will be recorded:

Progress is recorded week by week with the successful completion of each task. The final measure of success will be the creation of a completed spray of flowers. Each student will also be expected to complete an individual learning plan to monitor their learning goals and achievement throughout the course.

Any further next steps

Having mastered the basic skills required, the student can chose any number of sugar flower courses to continue learning e.g. Sugarcraft: Improvers Flower Making which follows on after this course.

What else will you need to do	We ask all students to complete an enrolment form which asks for details required by the Education & Skills Funding Agency & the County Council and is a requirement of entry to the course. We ask for full payment prior to the course beginning. Please note refunds can only be made if a class is cancelled or closed.
