## Dear Parent/Carer

Despite being only 6 weeks in length this half term has been very challenging. I am very grateful for your support and the hard work of all the staff and students in making this term a success.

You might recall that we started January with a phased return of students, we had the late notice of COVID testing of students and then, within a couple of days, we had moved to a full national lockdown and a return to remote learning. Against the constant media briefings that future earnings will be greatly reduced, years of catch up will be required etc. etc. we can be confident that our work, in partnership, will ensure that students slip back into the planned delivery of the curriculum with very little discomfort when we are able to welcome the full college back.

While we can't say for sure when the return to school for all will come, we are ready and raring to go as soon as we know it is safe. We are waiting for the announcements that are due on 22<sup>nd</sup> February and we will then take some time to digest and reflect on what is the best model for all students and staff.

## **Engagement reports**

When the term restarts on  $22^{nd}$  February we will continue with our live lessons and you should expect the third engagement report to be collated during that first week and it should be sent home to you by  $2^{nd}$  March at the latest. These updates are for your information and to support you in ensuring that you know which subjects your child is, or is not, engaging with. We will endeavour to contact home in the extreme cases or when we have seen a pattern of patchy engagement over the term so far. However, this is a very time-consuming activity, and I would rather ask for your support in encouraging engagement at home so that I can ask staff to focus on producing effective live lessons.

## **Parent Survey**

We had 350 responses from parents and the feedback resulted in us making tweaks to the length of lessons and the amount of additional homework at Key Stage 3.
