Community & Voluntary Controlled Schools outside Cambridge City:

Children with a statement of special educational need which names the school or for whom this is the only school that can meet their long-term medical needs;</li> <li>2. Children who live in the catchment area, attend primary schools within the catchment area and who have a sibling at the school at the time of admission;</li> <li>3. Children who live in the catchment area with a sibling at the school at the time of admission;</li> <li>4. Children who live in the catchment area who attend the primary schools within it;</li> <li>5. Children who live in the catchment area;</li> <li>6. Children who live outside the catchment area, who attend primary schools within it and who have a sibling at the school at the time of admission;</li> <li>7. Children who live outside the catchment area who have a sibling at the school at the time of admission;</li> <li>8. Children who live outside the catchment area who attend the primary schools within the catchment area;</li> <li>9. Children who live outside the catchment area, but nearest the school according to the shortest available, safe, walking route.</li> </ol>				
In cases of equal merit, priority will go first to children who are looked after (in the care of Social Service) and then to children living nearest the school according to the shortest available safe walking route.
