The Award equips 15-18 year olds with the leadership and life skills they need to step up and take ownership for their future, and the confidence to go for opportunities they may never have thought possible.

Maxine Hughes, Careers Lead at Rotherham Aspire, A Pupil Referral Unit in Rotherham supported through this scheme said:

"This has had a huge impact on our students. They've developed confidence, team working and leadership skills. When they transition into the working world now, they have self-belief and that is massive. The students feel like they've been recognised and believed in, and that is everything. This has made a huge difference to our students and for that I am truly grateful."

Elke Edwards, founder of lvy House London, ran one of Europe's leading executive development businesses for 20 years, worked with senior leaders at over 40% of the FTSE 100 and won more than 40 awards. But for all the success, she was frustrated by one thing.

She said: "Why are we only bringing this learning to people who have already reached the pinnacle of their careers? Why aren't we bringing this kind of profound development to young people at a time when it could change the whole course of their lives? My ambition is for this learning to be accessible to any student, irrespective of their background, the school they go to or how much their parents earn."


