- From Year 9, students will make some choices about the subjects they study.
- You and your parents or carers will need to think about what courses you will study...

2 or 3 GCSEs (Some students will study Separate Sciences in GCSE Biology, Chemistry & Physics from year 10, all others will study Combined Science)

Religious Studies

Currently Year 9 and Year 10 are being prepared for entry for the full GCSE in Religious Studies at the end of Year 10. A decision on whether to enter the current Year 8 in this way will be made in the coming months based on feedback and staffing








Why make choices now?

- Previous/traditional model:
 - KS3: Years 7,8,9 (9 terms)
 - KS4: Years 10 & 11 (5¹/₂ terms)
- Giving students the time to secure great outcomes.
- More time → deeper learning
 Y10 & 11: 70 weeks
 Y9,10 & 11: 109 weeks

Why make choices now?

- English, mathematics and science *gradually* introduce GCSE content through Year 9
- Three years allows for increased depth and challenge....
-and some additional time for learning
- Helps us to ensure that students have a wider choice of GCSEs or vocational qualifications (four options instead of the three choices many school now offer)









We have secured significant improvements to GCSE results since 2016. This year will be the first cohort to benefit from a three-year GCSE programme and we expect them to secure almost ¾ grade more on average in their option subjects as a result.



Pursuit of Excellence

What is the English Baccalaureate (Ebacc)?

- Introduced by the Government in 2010
- It comprises of GCSEs in 5 subjects (a sort of academic "Grand Slam")
- English, maths, science (including computer science), a modern language, history or geography
- For *most* students, it provides a sensible academic foundation for future work and study that leaves future options as open as possible.







What information do we use to guide students?

We look at a range of information to help guide our students towards the most appropriate subject choices:

- Current performance information
- Liaison with Curriculum Leaders
- Historical attainment (Year 6 / CATs/ PIE and PIM data)
- Effort and attitude to learning information
- Consultation with Senior Tutors
- Evidence based but flexible






How have things changed recently?

- A move away from examined *modules* at GCSE

 mostly terminal, end of
 course exams
- 1970's 80's: All exams in one go at the end
- No resits for GCSE.
- All GCSEs are now graded 1-9 (9 being the highest!)

Choosing the right subjects...




- Don't choose because of the teacher
- Don't choose because your friends are doing it
- This process is important, but not life-threatening!

We are very good at this. More than 95% of our students received their preferred choices and less than 5% of these changed one of their subject choices in the 1st term
