The quiz focuses on big chunks of your personality to put you into a category. It then uses easy to remember animals to categorise you based on your characteristics. Research suggests people tend to prefer jobs and tasks that match their natural strengths, so by doing the quiz, it can give you career ideas based on the answers you give.


It will tell you things such as:

- Historian**: Research, analyse, record and explain the past as recorded in sources, such as government and institutional records, newspapers and other periodicals, photographs, diaries, letters, accounts, maps, and oral traditions, such as interviews and oral history.
- Dancer**: Dance can be used to perform for the audience or to record performance.
- Printing administrator**: Printing administration is the production process of the printing, packaging and graphics industry.
- Music director**: Direct and coordinate musical or vocal performances by musical groups, such as orchestras or bands.
- TV presenter**: The presenter reads or discusses, introduces and hosts programmes, from morning news to entertainment and lifestyle.
- Make-up artist**: Make-up artists design and apply hair for people appearing on camera or in front of the audience.
- Classical musician**: Classical instrumental and singers perform classical music in concert, on radio, TV or other recordings.
- Illustrator**: Illustrators produce drawings, paintings or graphics to use to produce the look and graphics of a book or packaging.
- Fine artist**: Fine artists create original works of art using methods like painting, drawing and sculpture.
- Photographer**: Photographers take and arrange pictures of people, places, products, activities.
- Animator**: Animators bring drawings and computer-generated characters to life on screen.
- Pop musician**: Pop musicians perform and record different styles of music.
- Medical illustrator**: Medical illustrators produce photographs, art and graphical images for use in health care.
- Costume designer**: Costume designers are responsible for the overall look of the clothes and costumes in movies, TV or theatrical productions.
- Broadcast journalist**: Broadcast journalists research and present news stories and social programmes on television or radio.
- Media researcher**: Media researchers research and analyse by finding information, people and places for television or radio programmes.

LEVEL 1 OR 2 COURSE AT COLLEGE & RETAKE ENGLISH AND MATHS

A-Levels: a traditionally academic route, usually requires a grade 6 in the GCSE subjects to be able to study the A-Level curriculum

Vocational Courses: full-time courses that provide a practical approach by applying learning to real life situation

T-Levels: equivalent to 3 A-Levels—80% of the course is in the classroom, 20% in a meaningful industry placement

Apprenticeships: employed to do a real job while studying for a qualification, usually one day a week at a college or training centre

Traineeships: skills development programme that includes an unpaid work placement, lasting from 6 weeks up to a year
