

Fallacy of qualitative reports

- Purpose of reports is to share progress, attitude to learning, behaviour etc – although – any major concerns should be shared outside the reporting window – not about proving how well teachers know your children
- Comments comment banks/copy and pasted/are not individualised
- Poor value for time input required against impact















Academic mentoring

- Noticeably absent from feedback on reports
- Review meeting between student and tutor at least twice a year – review the report, progress and activities outside school
- Parents should receive either an email or phone call from tutors at least twice a year






























Reporting and Communication

- Improve awareness of grades and codes used on report
- Clarify what Ely Expects means and how it is used
- Increase detail on type of behaviour points and achievement points
- Clear expectations for all tutors on Academic Mentoring easier for parents to raise concerns
- 1 Meet the Tutor evening for Year 7 and 8 only with three reports
- 1 Parent evening with teachers (video conference) for Year 9-13 with three reports






Action areas

- Work on peer-on-peer harassment has improved greatly on serious incidents – need to filter down to lower level exchanges
- Review safeguarding procedures and training for trips new staff
- New SENDCO for Sept review QFT and awareness of SEND passports with staff
- Enhance quality of ADPR forms ensure that teachers and TA's are using the ADPR as part of classroom practise
- Ensure that relaunch of student voice is celebrated and the group have a demonstrable impact on college development
- Articulate a vision that celebrates a culture of praise and reward















- Form and houses...'Forms build a relationship and is there throughout the whole time in school, to be able to see the other years think is nice...'
- School focusses on poor behaviour, don't get rewarded proportionate to detentions. 'What do you get for 5 achievement points, we know what you get for 5 behaviour point.'
