Ely College Anti-Bullying & Anti-Discrimination Pledge

Bullying: Behaviour by an individual or group, repeated over time that intentionally hurts another individual or group either physically or emotionally.

What constitutes Discrimination...

Any comments or actions perceived to be:

Ageist - Biphobia - Body shaming - Disability or SEN-related - Homophobic - Marital or civil - partnership status related - Pregnancy related - Racist – National Origin - Religious - Sexism or sexual bullying - related to social class -Transphobic.

The perception of others maybe different to the target audience of your actions or comments which you may consider “banter” and you need to recognise and manage your behaviours appropriately.

I understand that if I am involved in bullying or discriminatory behaviours the college will respond in the following way...

- In the first instance where a student has bullied another/others a letter will be sent home that clearly outlines behaviour(s) of this type is not tolerated.
- If this approach was to persist, it would be recorded on my behaviour log that I had bullied. I understand that this will be defined by the type of bullying that has taken place and a suitable sanction will be provided in line with the college behaviour policy.
- I understand that persistent incidents of bullying or incidents of discrimination will result in further sanctions, in accordance with our behaviour procedures.
